1.		<p>Carved out in sandstone, about 4 metres-high, a border sign in the form of a little shrine was built in 1450 on orders of Zbigniew Oleśnicki, the Bishop of Cracow and later a Cardinal, to mark out the Church property from lands owned by a knight whose coat-of-arms was Zabawa. The Latin inscription on it reads: "This sign-post separates the property of the Church and the landlord. May 4, 1450. What is on the right, I give to the clergy, what is on the left, I give to the landlords."</p> <p>On one side of the post we can see the coat-of-arms "Dębno" covered with a red hat (the coat-of-arms of Cardinal Oleśnicki). This border sign stands atop a 2 metres high rock postument. It is the oldest and best preserved such historical object in Poland.</p>	<p>Biskupice Radłowskie, close to the village of Zabawa in the municipality of Radłów, Tarnów county, Małopolskie Province.
